Domestic Violence Requirement

The 1996 Kentucky General Assembly passed legislation, which in part requires primary care physicians to complete an approved three-hour training course in domestic violence. Primary care physicians, who are granted licensure after July 1, 1996, are required to successfully complete the course within three years of the date of initial licensure. It should be noted that the three-hour domestic violence requirement may be applied toward the total sixty hour CME required for the current cycle.

Primary care as defined by KRS 164.925 includes professional's practicing:

- Family/General Practice
- General Pediatrics
- General Internal Medicine
- Emergency Medicine
- General Obstetrics and Gynecology
- Preventive Medicine/Public Health
